LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

"It's not really about the competition. Your biggest challenge in a race is yourself. You're often racing against time. You're frequently running everything through your mind. You're always competing against preconceived ideas. It's not really the person next to you that you worry about." Summer Sanders

Dear Members.

It is completely unacceptable that we have ended this years Legislative Session (June 30th) with leaving off the table any incentives for the State of New Jersey that leave us now at an even lesser competitive disadvantage than all of our neighboring States. It is a good for our State to continue to look at the success, challenges or even failures of programs that utilize the taxpayer's money. However, when you look at numerous reports, we continue to rank in the lowest percentiles in terms of Business Climate, competitive ranking and economic metric.

"Our policymakers all agree that tax incentives are an important and effective tool in New Jersey's overall economic development toolkit. To not have this tool at its disposal for any length of time will render us even less competitive when we already lag behind the region and the nation in economic growth." I want to be very clear in stating this, New Jersey has tremendous advantage over every other State in this Country. We have tremendous assets in education, our workforce talent is top notch, our infrastructure and proximity to the largest markets in the world, New York and Philadelphia position us right in the middle of what should be a superior advantage. The diversity that New Jersey has in our people, arts, culture and tourism stand out like no other State. So, I ask why are we in the position we are?

The two quotes by Summer Sanders, the two-time US Gold Medalist in swimming, sum it up for me. Let's start fixing what is wrong within our State structure, let's put the partisanship aside, the internal debates within parties and get out of our own way to get the ship righted once again. We need to see the big picture.

"Gov. Murphy and our legislative leaders must quickly adopt an economic incentive program that incentivizes businesses to come to New Jersey, to stay here, and to grow here. This must be a priority with a goal of creating a national model that enhances our competitiveness with a robust economic development tool." Tom Bracken, NJ State Chamber President

New Jersey has always had the competitive advantage but companies are looking toward New York, Lehigh Valley and Philadelphia which all have strong incentive programs. The programs and incentives that we can put on the table need to be equitable for both our urban centers and our suburbs. The days of putting one region of our State ahead of another must come to end. The whole of New Jersey must be packaged and presented to increase and improve our business climate.

In May, the Hunterdon County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors spent the better part of the day having their Annual Board Retreat. This gave the members of the Board an opportunity to evaluate the successes and priorities of the organization as they prepare to begin the Strategic Planning initiative for the Chamber.

The Board looked at a 10 year snapshot of the Chamber's major milestones and numerous initiatives it has spearheaded. Chamber President Chris Phelan gave a presentation on those items that are highlighted on the adjacent timeline. The Chamber Board Retreat covered areas on how to retain and attract strong Business Leadership. The Board discussed our work regarding the Advocacy the Chamber does on behalf of the Business Community, being the "Voice of Business."

The day also covered an exercise to look at the "Forces of Change" in the business environment here in Hunterdon County. Some of the issues that face our Business Community that were discussed were affordability, workforce development, the impact of evolving technology on businesses, and economic development.







Tax Tidbit:



Certified Public Accountants, PC Federal Opportunity Zones

The Qualified Opportunity Zone (QOZ) program was enacted as part of the 2017 federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) and is designed to direct long-term capital investments into eligible property located in a Qualified Opportunity Zone. There are 8,762 designated QOZ's located throughout the United States, of which 8,532 are in low-income community tracts and 230 contiguous communities. Every county in New Jersey has at least one QOZ.

The TCJA provides benefits for investments in the designated zones through Qualified Opportunity Funds (QOF). Investors must make their investment through a QOF and not directly into property located within a QOZ. The QOF must be organized as either a partnership or a corporation, that is invests at least 90 percent of its assets in eligible property, located in a QOZ. Investors can defer federal taxes on capital gains, if they reinvest those gains in a QOF. These deferred capital gains are not taxed until the investment is sold or exchanged, or December 31, 2026. To encourage long-term investment, the investor will receive a step-up in the tax basis of the previously deferred gain of 10% after holding the QOF investment for 5 years. This will increase to 15% if the QOF investment is held for 7 years. The Act also provides for the elimination of federal tax on the post-acquisition gain, from the sale of the QOF after the investment is held for 10 years or longer.

The QOF must meet recordkeeping requirements in order to maintain eligibility and avoid penalties. Investors in the QOF's also have recordkeeping requirements that they must follow in order to preserve their anticipated tax benefits. The Qualified Opportunity Zone tax benefits are for Federal taxes. State and local tax treatment will vary.

Hunterdon County Chamber Partners with Prevention Resources to Reduce Youth Vaping

Prevention Resources and the Safe Communities Regional Coalition of Hunterdon have launched a new project. Hunterdon United for Vape-Free Youth is working in partnership with community leaders and agencies including the Chamber of Commerce, Prosecutor's Office, County Freeholders, One Voice, Partnership for Health, RVCC, Hunterdon Healthcare and the Regional High Schools, to address the growing concern surrounding youth vaping. The objective is to provide resources for students, parents, and school faculty members with the goal of helping our community make informed decisions about vaping. According to Lesley Gabel, Co-CEO of Prevention Resources and the Safe Communities Coalition, "Our goal is to educate and raise awareness on the risks and dangers of Vaping, through collaboration and outreach." Facts you may not know about youth vaping:

- A 'vape' is the term used to describe the delivery mechanism of products such as JUUL, nicotine, ejuices, THC, and alcohol.
- In 2018, the Surgeon General declared e-cigarette (vape) use among youth a national epidemic.
- Schools ranked teen vaping as the number one problem in Hunterdon County (Key Informant 2019).
- Most youth do not know the ingredients in these products.
- Even products that claim they are nicotine-free may contain nicotine due to lack of regulation.
- Nicotine exposure during adolescence can harm the brain, as it is still developing up to age 25.
- Teen nicotine use increases the likelihood of future drug use, including tobacco products and marijuana.
